Things are growing in Lupe's Community Garden. The rain alternating with the sun has been great for vegetables... as well as weeds. We are busy planting lettuce, eggplant, cabbage, cucumbers, beans (green, yellow, & purple), and squash. Some new vegetables we are trying out this year include celery, kohlrabi, and purple potatoes. Several different varieties of tomatoes have been planted. These include chocolate cherry tomato and the popular sweet and tasty Sun Gold cherry. Also growing are some slicing varieties, such as Siletz and Pruden's Purple, and Cour di Bue, and Silver Fir tomato. Also, new this year is a sandbox for kids built by the Eagle Scouts and big flower bed!
