Lupe's Community Garden has announced their opening date, and hours are listed below and on the <u>PCS website</u>. This year, the Graden is also renting out plots. Here is more info in a welcome message from Natalie Cover, our Graden Program Manager:

Spring is here, and the Garden is gearing up for its peak season. To start, the Garden hosted a fruit tree pruning clinic in early March. It was a wonderful day since it didn't rain, and half of the orchard got pruned. More events are to come as summer approaches, including children's activities.

Another project of the Garden is sprouting up (literally) and filling up our greenhouse with plant starts. The goal is to provide a variety of plants to both Nancy's Food Pantry clients and the gardeners in our community plots. We are taking applications from folks interested in gardening in a community setting.

The Garden will hold Open Garden Hours **every Wednesday, starting April 16, from 9:30-11:00 AM**. 


June's Kids Kloset Wishlist
