


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Dear Neighbors,

This year, PCS had the privilege of participating in cherished local events such as the Philomath Farmers' Market, the Philomath Frolic & Rodeo Grand Parade, Trunk or Treat, and Philomath's Parade of Lights. These community engagements remind us that we are truly as our moto says: *People Helping People*.

We are proud to celebrate several milestones, including the successful launch of our March on Hunger food drive, the installation of new floodlights, new signage, and hosting garden workshops. We also marked the one-year anniversary of our Executive Director, Sharon Thornberry, whose leadership continues to inspire positive change. Additionally, we welcomed Dale Carter as our new Facilities Manager. Clients Served

In 2024, Philomath Community Services provided social services to hundreds of individuals. Specifically, our programs served:

Food Pantry

- \star 156 households were served, on average, per month.
- \star 484 people were served, on average, per month.
- \star 1,875 visits to the Food Pantry through the year.
- \star 39% of the recipients were under the age of 18.

June's Kid Kloset

- \star 72 households were served, on average, per month.
- \star 331 people were served, on average, per month.
- \star 864 visits to the Kids' Kloset through the year.
- \star 27% of volunteer time was donated by clients.

Community Gleaners

- \star 238 households participated, on average, per month.
- \star That is an average of 83 Gleaner households, 155 Adoptee households.
- \star participated in weekly distributions.

Holiday Cheer

- **\star 101** families were served.
- \star 263 children received gifts through this program.
- \star 152 parents and guardians received support.

Lupe's Community Garden

- ★ Two gardening workshops took place.
- \star Dozens of community members benefited from using the garden.
- \star 1,737 pounds of produce was distributed.

In-Kind Donations

The following In-Kind donations were processed in 2024:

- ★ Nancy's Food Pantry: **139,109** pounds of food and other goods.
- ★ PCS Gleaners: 350,339 pounds of food and goods (includes grant purchases.)
- ★ June's Kids Kloset: dozens of donations for 7,657 pounds total.
- **\star** Holiday Cheer: **603** pounds of new items, **1,390** pounds of used items.

Volunteer Hours

In 2024, **19,099** hours were recorded by well over **100** volunteers. According to the Nonprofit Leadership Center, the 2024 value of volunteer hours is \$33.49 per hour. This means that—thanks to the helping hands of our community—PCS had a cost savings of approximately **\$639,625** in wages!

- ★ Board of Directors and administrative volunteers: 767 hours.
- ★ Non-Board Members supporting general administration: 99 hours.
- ★ Nancy's Food Pantry: 11 volunteers per month on average for 2,168 hours total.
- ★ PCS Gleaners: 13,631 hours (and 31,171 personal vehicle miles.)
- \star June's Kids Kloset: 10 volunteers per month on average for 1,324 hours.
- ★ Lupe's Community Garden: 55 volunteers, 860 hours.
- ★ Holiday Cheer: 45 volunteers for 250 hours.

Monetary Funding

In addition to the donated time and in-kind goods detailed above, our gracious community of donors and grantors supported us with the following contributions:

- ★ 373 donations totaling \$147,419.22.
- ★ 14 grants totaling \$39,969.
